## Areas for improvement

There is a good range of learning trips or visits during school hours.

We try to ensure that every class has at least two trips during the school year. So far this academic year Class Two have visited the Bodmin recycling centre. Class Three have taken part in the stay safe workshops and the whole school had a visit from an artist this week.

The residential for Class Three has been booked for the summer term. The whole school are planning a visit to Truro to link with their topic this term. We are also hoping to take the whole school to the cinema. The PTFA have kindly offered to pay for the coaches for both of these trips. A field trip to link with our learning in Geography is also being planned.

Kernow King are coming in during the last week of this half term to lead an assembly focusing on Cornish mines.

We will continue to look for opportunities for visits and visitors and involve pupils in decisions about places they would like to visit to support them with their learning. However, we do also have to consider costs of trips as we are aware this can be expensive for families.
