Fundamental British Values in the Curriculum

THE DFE define the fundamental British Values as:



- Democracy
- The rule of law
- Individual liberty
- Mutual respect
- Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

British values are embedded in all areas of school life and built into the ethos of the schools. They are key themes throughout all curriculum areas, collective worship, pupil forums and enrichment opportunities.

Examples of where British values can be seen in Trust schools:

Democracy (making decisions together, the right to an opinion)

- History Commonwealth countries, British Monarchy
- Enrichment Visit to Houses of Parliament, visits from MPs
- Pupil Voice School Parliaments / Council / forum pupils are voted on to the forums and vote on decisions

The rule of law (understanding rules and why they are important)

- EYFS Rules when playing games
- PE Rules for games
- History Crime and Punishment
- School / Class Rules

Individual liberty (Freedom of speech for all, the right to make your own choices)

- PSHE Recognise individuality
- English Balanced arguments
- History World War Two, The Holocaust

Mutual respect (treating others as you want to be treated, respect, working together)

- PSHE Respecting self and others
- Computing Online safety respect for others online
- Anti-bullying week
- Rights Respecting Schools assemblies

Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs (learning about different faiths and cultures)

- Geography Research and compare the lives of children around the world linked to different continents
- PSHE Recognising ways they are the same and different to other people
- PE Dance from other cultures
- History Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age: Diverse range of cultures, communities, cultivation, traditions, immigration (Celts; Greeks; Romans), links made to modern societies across the World.
- *RE* Learning about a range of World Religions
- English Traditional poems in other cultures
- Music Studying musicians and music from a range of cultures
